

Marshall Community Fund

The Marshall Community Fund (including the Sir Arthur Marshall Community Fund) makes grants to support small, local voluntary and community groups and organisations that are undertaking charitable work in Cambridgeshire. There is a special interest in supporting groups based around the Cambridge airport.

Grants awarded

Examples of awards made include:

Abbey and Coleridge Action for Youth were awarded a grant to pay for a qualified coach and hire of astro turf to continue successful football project.

Abbey People were awarded a grant to purchase a secure metal tool shed with a good lock to provide storage for the Margaret Wright Community Orchard

Barnwell Baptist Church were awarded a grant to fund publicity, website design and new branding for new residents association.

Cam Sight (Cambridgeshire Society for the Blind and Partially Sighted) were awarded a grant to fund running of a group for visually impaired children and their families.

Cambridge Community Church were awarded a grant towards a self worth programme for 5 to 10 young people from Abbey Ward in an 8 week session

Cambridge Dial A Ride were awarded a grant towards running costs.
